



Online Teachers Wanted

Have you considered teaching an online class?

LAUSD's Instructional Technology Branch is offering an opportunity for high school teachers who are interested in teaching online classes in core academic and advanced placement classes at their schools to be trained as online instructors. The Los Angeles Virtual Academy is the District's online learning program available to school sites that want to offer online courses to students.

Teachers are invited to participate in a Basic Online Instructor Course. This introductory course involves a 2-day face-to-face meeting and a 6-week online component. It includes such topics as online methodology and administrative issues as well as items specific to LAVA such as course policies and record keeping. Participants may earn 2 salary point credits for successful completion of the course.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

- o District teacher with California Department of Education single subject teaching credential in the appropriate subject area.
- o Working knowledge of personal computers and the Internet.
- o Proficiency in using e-mail, managing files, using computer applications (e.g., Word, Excel, PowerPoint etc.).
- o Proficiency in using a Web browser and connecting to the Internet.
- o Possession and use of a valid LAUSD email account (e.g., LAUSDnet or ePals).
- o Recommendation of the school principal (see attached Administrator Recommendation Form).
