

SENIOR RADIOLOGIC TECHNOLOGIST

DEFINITION

Supervises and participates in the operation of an X-ray laboratory and takes X-rays.

TYPICAL DUTIES

Supervises and participates in the operation of an X-ray laboratory.
Takes X-rays develops films, and uses a film scanner.
Checks developed film for adequacy of print for diagnostic use.
Confers with medical staff concerning X-ray examinations.
Orders and maintains laboratory supplies.
Stores X-ray films.
Prepares summary reports based upon roentgenologists' evaluations of X-ray film.
Performs related duties as assigned.

DISTINGUISHING CHARACTERISTICS AMONG RELATED CLASSES

A Senior Radiologic Technologist takes X-rays, is responsible for the operations of an X-ray laboratory and supervise staff.

A Radiologic Technologist takes X-rays and develops and stores X-ray film.

SUPERVISION

General supervision is received from a physician. Supervision may be exercised over Radiologic Technologists.

Technical vocabulary required for X-ray reports and procedures

Take acceptable X-ray films
Operate X-ray equipment
Write clear and concise reports
Keep accurate records
Supervise effectively
Work without close supervision
Lift or move boxes of film

ENTRANCE QUALIFICATIONS

Education:

Graduation from high school or equivalent evidence of educational proficiency at the high school level.

Experience:

Two years of experience in radiologic technology.

Special:

State of California certification as a Radiologic Technologist by the Bureau of Radiological Health of California.

A valid California Driver License.

Occasional use of an automobile.
